This will serve as our official annual show day as the MG Dealership has arranged for the public to vote for the classic of the day. A prize will be presented to the winner.



## **British Chrome Bumper Sports Cars and Grills.**

It appears classic British Chrome Bumper Sports cars and grills are getting scarcer by the day. I am referring here to the MG and Triumph TR2 to TR 6 range.

Should you own one of these classic chrome bumper sports cars consider yourself lucky. The phasing out of these remarkable sports cars started in the early 1970's with the introduction of America's obsession of safety standards in sports cars.

The last of the annual revision of the chrome bumper MG cars was carried out in the autumn of 1973. It had dawned on the stylists within British Leyland that the recessed grille change introduced three years earlier had been less than successful. Therefore, the vertical bars on the egg shape grille, similar to the original one was reintroduced.

The American market cars were fitted with modified bumpers and used energy-absorbing overriders early in 1974. The huge energy-absorbing overriders on the American export car was a short-term solution to safety regulations.

Faced with the job of meeting impact requirements and matching ruling that the bumpers had to be a standard ruling for all cars involved a substantial redesign for the MGB. Extra weight of the larger and heavier rubber-faced bumpers mounted front and rear as well as extra weight on the chassis increased weight considerably.

The result was performance and handling as well as increase in ride height was compromised severely. The MGB was no longer the nippy sports car it used to be. Luckly the cars built for the British market was still available for a few years with the original chrome bumpers and grills. Once however these MGs were no longer available in the UK many owners reverted their new MGB'S to the original chrome bumpers and grills.

Without going into detail, the sad history of the Triumph TR models, post 1974 went the same route as "American export classic British sports cars" compared to the MG's.

Therefore, if you are a proud owner of any of these chrome bumper British sports cars hold on to them as long as possible. They are "first class classics".
